Parking - St. Paulinus Primary School run a successful designated 'Drop and Go' zone on Temple Road. This scheme has helped ease congestion here, resolving some parking issues and helps keep pupils safe. This is because pupils are dropped off on the same side of the road as the School. The zone is close to the School gate and parents and carers have a safe legal place to pull into. Mrs. Oakley and Mrs. Spencer (members of our staff) monitor the 'Drop & Go Zone' and general parking on Temple Road. They are responsible for ensuring that children are led into the school safely. Parents can therefore leave their children with them in the secure knowledge that they will be safely escorted onto school premises. Please can I remind parents / carers who use this area not to park here on a morning. If you need to take your child into school, we ask that you find safe alternate parking, even if this means parking away from Temple Road. Traffic wardens will be issuing out parking fines! Also please do not obstruct the school gates when parking to collect your child/ren from After School Clubs. It is becoming very difficult for everyone to make their way in and out of the road safely. From a safequarding perspective and to keep all children safe, the school has negotiated an alternative parking area within easy walking distance from the school for this purpose; parents can park in Crow Nest car park (off Heckmondwike Road).

Please stress to your child/ren the dangers of 'Stranger Danger'.

The safety of your children is paramount so this week in school we have been talking about keeping safe and 'Stranger Danger'. Please can we ask you to talk to your children at home about these issues too? Some rules to remember around stranger danger are:



- Never accept gifts or sweets.
- Never get in a car with a stranger.
- Never go anywhere with a stranger.
- Never tell a stranger your name, age or address.

Remind the children about who they can talk to at home and in school and remind them of how important it is that they tell a trusted adult if they don't feel safe. Examples of a trusted adult are: a parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle, teacher, classroom support assistant or a lunchtime supervisor.


