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Remembrance Day - November is the traditional month to remember those who have died. On Sunday 11th November it will be Remembrance Sunday and at the beginning of November, we remember all those who have died on All Souls' Day. It is appropriate that these events happen during autumn. The changing appearance of the trees at this time of year seems particularly poignant. It is an appropriate analogy to compare the falling leaves on a tree with those who have died. The trees look so barren, bare and lifeless. When a loved one dies then our lives are often filled with desolation and emptiness, just like trees can feel during wintertime.

It is thought that the red of the petals represents the blood of those who gave their lives, the black button in the middle is for the mourning of those who never welcomed their loved ones home and the green leaf shows the hope that the grass and crops growing after the war brings.



Wear should a poppy be worn - some people say a poppy should be worn on the left lapel, to keep it close to your heart it also the side that medals are worn by the Armed forces. Others argue that the symbol should be displayed on the left by men and the right by women, the traditional positions of a badge or brooch. The positioning of the flower's leaf has also prompted debate, with one $\,$ theory dictating that it should be at 11 oʻclock, representing the Armistice being signed at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. However, the British Legion insists there is no right or wrong way, saying: "The best way to wear one is with pride."

Why are they selling poppies, Mummy? Selling poppies in town today. The poppies, child, are flowers of love. For the men who marched away.


But why have they chosen a poppy, Mummy? Why not a beautiful rose? Because my child, men fought and died In the fields where the poppies grow.
