Year 4 - Summer Term Curriculum Letter

Welcome back, we hope that you have all had a lovely Easter break and are looking forward to the summer term.

This term we are looking forward to lots of new and exciting things again.

Our topic this term is 'Why are the Rainforests important to us all?'

In this topic we will explore the Tropical Rainforests of the world.

The topic will be brought to life with a trip to Flamingo Land Zoo during the term. We will use artefacts and historical information to enhance and improve our reading, writing and history skills.

You can support your child's learning by helping them research Rainforests. If you do not have internet access at home, you can always use the library which will have plenty of books on the subject.

We will be learning about a wide spectrum of facts from the location of rainforests to the plants, animals and people that live in them. We will also learn about how rainforests are to survive in our modern age.

In <u>R.E.</u> the topics are 'Mission of the Church' and 'Belonging to the Church'. Parents are encouraged to start discussions with children relating to these topics focusing on key terminology and its meaning. For example, how was the Church founded, who is the Pope and why is the Church important to our faith?

In <u>Mathematics</u> we will be focussing on basic skills, shape and problem solving (further information can be found on the topic plan). To help your children you need to provide your children with opportunities to practise their times tables, recap on using the four basic operations, and encourage problem solving relating to real life issues, using with money and measure as an example. We would also ask you to encourage your children to tell the time, using both analogue and digital clocks. During the summer term, the children will complete a times table check during June where they will be required to answer 25 questions and have 6 seconds for each question.

In <u>English</u> we will use real life and fictional stories from the war to help children develop a greater understanding of what happened and the effect this had on the people involved. We will debate the arguments for and against evacuating the children to the countryside and write letters and stories describing the experiences and feelings of evacuees. As parents / carers you can support at home by helping your child to complete homework relating to our class work and pointing out descriptive writing, encouraging discussions around why it is a good piece of writing. You could also do some research on the war with your child using the internet or your local library.

Our <u>Science</u> links with our topic as we will be investigating living things. We will incorporate plants and animals from the Rainforest into our learning and look at how living things can be classified (mammals, amphibians etc.)

In <u>PSHE</u> we will be exploring the topic 'Journey in Love.' The title of the topic for Year 4 is "God loves us in our differences". The focus of this work will be to celebrate differences as we grow and develop in the womb. They will consider how a baby grows in the womb and how we grow once we are born. They will look at who they are and how they are special and unique.

Physical Education (P.E.) - is on Thursday mornings

A P.E. kit consists of: a white t-shirt, blue (or black) shorts, and a pair of trainers for outdoor use, which they <u>should</u> leave in school, ready to be worn on these days. As an optional extra, a dark coloured pair of jogging trousers and a jumper can also be worn when we are outside.

As the weather is due to get warmer, children may bring in a water bottle and wear a plain blue / black hat when outside.

As always, the **only** jewellery permitted in school is a pair of plain small stud earrings. If your child has pierced ears, if you could remove them on each morning of P.E., that would be appreciated.

Please note that staff are not able to remove earrings or cover them, so this will result in your child not taking part in our P.E. lesson and an alternative task will be provided for the child, this is due to health and safety reasons.

Long hair must be tied back.

Please ensure your child has a P.E. kit in school at all times. All P.E. kit must be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can easily be returned to the rightful owner.

<u>Swimming</u> – takes place on <u>Friday mornings</u>. Please refer to the letter you received last July for further information on what your child requires.

<u>Homework</u> - This will be handed out on a **Wednesday** and <u>MUST</u> be completed and returned to school by the following **Wednesday**.

Children will have an independent reading book which will be brought home on a daily basis and <u>MUST</u> be returned to school every day. Children can be reading their own independent book from home or class reading area once they have finished the given book and completed a book review. Children's independent reading books are changed once a week in school. Reading records are to be completed each time you listen to your child read at home.

<u>School Trip</u> - To support Year 4 with their topic 'Why are the rainforests important to us all?', we have arranged a year group visit to Flamingo Land Zoo on **Wednesday 8**th **May.**
