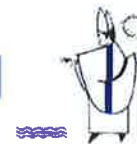

Year 2 - Autumn Term Curriculum Letter

Welcome back after the summer holidays! We hope that you have all enjoyed your summer break and are looking forward to the academic year ahead.

This term we are looking forward to lots of new and exciting things.

Our theme for this half term is 'Disasters'

Our Autumn term theme is based around The Great Fire of London and The Titanic. We will study London as the capital city of the U.K. and learn to locate it on a map. We will look into the History behind why the fire spread so quickly and how London was rebuilt. Further to that, we will look at houses and how ours are different to those in 1666. We will then move on to study the Titanic and what made it so famous. We will again use our geography skills to map its journey and discover why it sank.

In **R.E.** – we are covering the topics 'Chosen People' and 'Mysteries'. The children will listen to stories about God choosing Abraham, Moses and Daniel. They will also learn about The Trinity, Mary and Joseph and Jesus as God's gift to us.

In **Mathematics** – children will continue to follow the Maths Mastery Programme of Study. We will be looking at reading and writing numbers up to 100, addition and subtraction of 2 digit numbers and word problems linked to these methods. We will then use units of measure and apply our knowledge to read scales and order and compare length.

In **English** – we will be focusing on spelling and grammar, and using the texts 'The Day the Crayons Quit' and 'The Lonely Beast'. From this we will produce a recount, diary entries, letters and a retell. Please help by ensuring your child practises words from the Year 2 spelling list and read with them regularly at home.

In **Science** - the children will be learning about different materials and their properties, and also how materials can change.

Physical Education (P.E.) - will take place on **Wednesdays** and **Thursdays**.

The St. Paulinus P.E. kit consists of: a white t-shirt with the school logo, blue (or black) shorts, and a pair pumps. As an optional extra, a dark coloured pair of jogging trousers and a school P.E. hoodie or jumper can also be worn when we are outside / during the winter months.

- Children must come to school in their P.E. kit on their P.E. days and will stay in their P.E. kits throughout the day.

In addition, the **only** jewellery permitted in school is a pair of plain small stud earrings. If your child has pierced ears, then they need to remove their earrings on each morning of P.E.

Please note that staff are not able to remove earrings, so this will result in your child not taking part in our P.E. lessons and an alternative task will be provided for the child, this is due to health and safety reasons.

- Long hair **must** be tied back.
- All P.E. kit **MUST** be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can easily be returned to the rightful owner.
- **Please ensure your child wears their P.E. kit on their P.E. days.** If your child does not come to school in their P.E. kit, you may receive a text message to inform you that they need it for the following week. All P.E. kit and school uniform **must** be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can then be easily returned to the rightful owner.

Homework – Homework will be sent home every **Friday** evening. Homework is to be returned on or before the following **Wednesday**. It will build on what the children have been learning about in class.

Homework will consist of Maths, English and a spelling based activity to prepare for dictation spelling tests in school, looking at High frequency words and common exception words.

At the start of this half term the children will be tested on their number bonds to 10, before moving onto 20. After the half term holiday we will begin to test the children on their 2, 5 and 10 times tables on a Friday afternoon. Please begin to practise these with your child at home.

Reading - The children will have individual reading sessions once a week. They must bring their reading books to school on their reading day, which will be clearly labelled on their reading bag. They will receive two reading books which **MUST** be returned to school on their day. Please ensure that your child reads their reading book with someone at home and that the adult questions the understanding of the text read. So we know your child has read, please comment in their reading record.

Science – As scientists we will :

- Investigate materials suitable for different purposes.
- Which properties make materials suitable for different jobs?
- Look at similarities and differences between materials.
- Investigate circuits - what makes them work?
- Investigate the dangers of electricity and how to be safe.
- Look at the uses of electricity.

Computing – We will :

- Read and understand code.
- Remix code to achieve a particular outcome.
- Debugging algorithms.
- Use printed code snippets so that children can't run the code but must read it.
- Include unplugged activities and 'explaining' tasks e.g. 'how do variables work?'
- E-safety - use safety in balance with other activities.

P.S.H.E. – we will :

- Explore how to be a good friend.
- Learn about their feelings and having a positive mental health.

English – As writers and communicators we will :

- Write recounts of personal experiences.
- Write non-chronological reports linked to our topic.
- Write diary entries.
- Engage in meaningful discussions in all areas of the curriculum.
- Begin to use present and past tense correctly.
- Begin to self evaluate our writing independently and with an adult.
- Discuss and give our opinion on a variety of texts.
- Develop our spelling strategies and rules.

Music – As musicians we will :

- Listen to different environment noises and sort them according to their particular sound.
- Use a variety of different percussion instruments to represent the sound of the environment.

Design Technology – As designers we will :

- Look at 17th century houses, design our own and make the houses using a variety of different materials .
- Research the structure of the original Titanic.
- Design and make our own ships that would survive an iceberg collision.

Geography – As geographers we will be:

- Name and locate the 7 continents of the world on maps and on a globe.
- Name and locate the 5 oceans of the world on maps and on a globe.
- Use locational and positional language.

R.E. – As theologians we will :

- Know why different people were chosen by God (Abraham, Moses, Daniel and Joseph).
- Know we are chosen to help others.
- Know about the mystery of the Trinity.
- Reflect on why God chose Mary and Joseph.
- Know about and reflect on mysteries.
- Know that Jesus is God's gift to us and what this means for us.

Numeracy – As mathematicians we will :

- Know the place value of 2 and 3 digit numbers
- Know our number bonds to 10 and 20.
- Compare and order numbers to 100. Use < and >
- Add and subtract 1 and 2 digit numbers.
- Recognize and name 2D and 3D shapes.
- Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5.
- Use multiplication and division facts for 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables.
- Recognize odd and even numbers.
- Recognize, find, name and write fractions, $1/3$, $1/4$, $2/4$ and $3/4$.
- Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement.
- To tell the time to 5 minutes including quarter past and quarter to.
- Construct pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables and ask and answer questions about them.
- Problem solving will be included in ALL areas of numeracy.

History – As historians we will :

- Learn about two historical significant events; The Great Fire of London and the sinking of the Titanic.
- Learn about the life of a significant individual-Samuel Pepys-who has contributed to our history.
- Discover how things such as houses, methods of communication, society and classes have changed over the years.

Art – As artists we will :

- Explore mark making using paints, brushes and other tools
- Investigate and use materials and processes to communicate ideas and meaning.
- Explore expressive mark making in response to music and begin to explore and record objects and arrangements from different viewpoints.

P.E. – As athletes we will :

- Practice different dance and gymnastic skills
- Follow and create dance routines.
- Use equipment safely.
