Year 2 - Spring Term Curriculum Letter

Welcome back after the Christmas holidays! We hope that you have all had a lovely Christmas / New Year and are looking forward to the academic year ahead.

Our theme this term is Inventions, particularly focussing on Travel and Transport.

We will be learning about inventions, such as those of: cars and trains, the first aeroplane flight and the first moon landing. We will also identify and describe differences between places around the world comparing these to our local area.

In <u>R.E.</u> we are covering the topics of The Good News and The Mass through our scheme The Way, The Truth and The Life. We will be looking at Bible stories such as Jairus' daughter and learning about the signs and symbols of the Mass. This term the children need to be able to say two key prayers of: 'The Hail Mary' and 'The Our Father'.

In <u>Mathematics</u> we continue to follow the Maths Mastery scheme. Please ensure your child recognises and can write in numeral numbers up to 100. They also need to know their number bonds to 20 and be able to count in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10. You can support your child at home by chanting in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10 and asking quick fire timetable questions. The children will also be learning how to tell the time and use fractions to help them solve problems.

In <u>English</u> we will be writing for different purposes using a variety of sentence types, our knowledge of spelling rules, punctuation and grammar. We will be developing our comprehension and inference skills in our individual and whole class reading. Please help your child by reading a variety of different texts, asking questions about their day and encourage them to write diaries and their own stories. Our main focuses will be instructional writing, a recount and letter writing.

In <u>Science</u> the children will be learning about and classifying living things and their habitats. We will compare the skeleton of animals and humans and be looking at how different animals adapt to live. We will learn how animals and humans grow and be able to name the different stages of life. The children also will learn about the importance of healthy eating, exercise and hygiene.

<u>Physical Education (P.E.)</u> – is on **Wednesday and Thursday**, so children <u>must</u> ensure their P.E. kits are in school ready to be worn on these days.

The St. Paulinus P.E. kit consists of: a white t-shirt with the school logo, blue (or black) shorts, and a pair pumps/trainers. As an optional extra, a dark coloured pair of jogging trousers and a school P.E. hoodie or jumper can also be worn when we are outside / during the winter months. Please may we take this opportunity to kindly remind all families that the School PE kit is uniform and that pupils should not come to school in clothes that do not form the School PE kit.

➤ Children must come to school in their P.E. kit on their P.E. days and will stay in their P.E. kits throughout the day.

In addition, the **only** jewellery permitted in school is a pair of plain small stud earrings. If your child has pierced ears, then they need to remove their earrings on each morning of P.E.

Please note that staff are not able to remove earrings, so this will result in your child not taking part in our P.E. lessons and an alternative task will be provided for the child, this is due to health and safety reasons.

- > Long hair **must** be tied back.
- All P.E. kit <u>MUST</u> be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can easily be returned to the rightful owner.
- Please ensure your child wears their P.E. kit on their P.E. days. If your child does not come to school in their P.E. kit, you may receive a text message to inform you that they need it for the following week. All P.E. kit and school uniform <u>must</u> be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can then be easily returned to the rightful owner.

Homework, Times tables and Spellings

The children will need to read at home and practise their sounds on a weekly basis to help with their writing. This term we are not sending spelling lists home. Instead children will be taking part in sentence dictation on Friday afternoons. Children will hear a sentence and will have to write it from memory after hearing it three times. HFW's and common exception words will be used in these sentences. We will begin to test the children on their 2, 5 and 10 timetables on a Friday so these will be sent home to learn weekly. Please begin to practise these with your child at home.

Homework will be sent out on a **Friday** and <u>MUST</u> be completed and returned to school by the following <u>Wednesday</u>. It will build on what the children have been learning about in class. Homework will consist of times tables/ number bonds, high frequency spellings, a maths piece and an English piece.

Reading

The children will continue to read as much as possible in school to an adult on a weekly basis. Children will receive two reading books on Monday which <u>MUST</u> be returned to school by Friday. Please ensure that your child reads their reading book with someone at home every night, as this has a very positive impact on their progress across the curriculum. Reading records will be given to the children for parents to fill out as and when their child reads during the week at home. Don't forget to use Bug Club.

Thank you for your continued patience during this difficult time. A little guide to the St. Paulinus remote education available to your child:




Google Classroom

Geography - As geographers we will:

- To identify and describe the main differences between a place in England, eg. Dewsbury and a small place in a non-European country, eg. Mexico or Ghana.
- To identify and describe similarities and differences between the 2 places: human features and physical features such as trade links, buildings, city, town, village, factories, farms, ports etc.
- To create a simple map of a small area using symbols for places and a key,

Science - As scientists we will

- Classify and identify different animals.
- Look at growth and basic needs of humans, animals and plants.
- Identify different body parts.
- Look at similarities and differences between animals that live in warm and cold climates.

Computing - We will:

- Look at online safety and the importance of it.
- Look at spreadsheets and how they are used.

History - As historians we will:

- Know how the invention of trains affected travel.
- Find out about the invention of cars.
- Learn about the first aeroplane flights.
- Find out about the first moon landing.

English - As writers and communicators we will:

- Write non-chronological reports and recounts.
- Write stories.
- Read a wide variety of both fiction and non fiction.
- Use different sentence types in our writing.
- Use our knowledge of spelling and grammar to improve our work.
- Use past and present tense correctly.
- Evaluate our writing with an adult and independently.
- Discuss and give opinions on a variety of texts.

Art - As artists we will:

- Develop feeling responses to music

- Create pattern using colour and shape
- Use imagination to create a painted image
