## Year 5 - Spring Term Curriculum Letter

Welcome back after the Christmas holidays! We hope that you have all had a lovely Christmas / New Year and are looking forward to the academic year ahead.

### Our theme this term is 'China'

We will be covering the novels 'The Firework Maker's Daughter'.

The theme will extend through many subject areas including English, History and Geography.

It will give children a great insight in to Chinese culture.

Our theme will use many skills learnt throughout the term resulting in children writing their own diary entries, persuasive writing and Chinese myths. Children will have the opportunity to use their artistic skills this term along with their designing skills to plan and design Terracotta warriors, Chinese lanterns and watercolour calligraphy. This is a very exciting theme drawing on many skills with lots of fun and meaningful activities enabling learning

to be stimulating and fun.

In <u>Religious Education (RE)</u>, the learning will focus on 'Inspirational people' and 'Reconciliation'. Parents are encouraged to start discussions with children relating to these topics discussing what constitutes an inspirational person, what do they do to attract such interest.

In <u>Mathematics</u> we will continue to focus on basic skills (the four operations= add, subtract, divide and multiply) and problem. To further support your child you need to provide them with opportunities to practice their times tables and encourage problem solving relating to real life issues, such as money and measures for example.

In <u>English</u> we will be studying the novel 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman. This will allow us to develop our writing through recounts from various chapters in the novel. We will show our empathy with the characters through writing diary entries. We will also write character descriptions. As parents / carers you can support at home by helping your child encouraging discussions around the topic of China and looking for words to describe a certain aspect of China.

In <u>Science</u> we will be continuing with the theme of Forces and Motion and will move on to learning about Materials and their Properties. At home, children could continue their learning by researching materials to help them further engage with the learning, i.e. Do they know the definition of a solid, liquid or gas? Do they know which materials will dissolve? Do they know how to separate materials? Do they know which materials are good conductors of heat?

## Physical Education (P.E.) - - is on Mondays and Thursdays,

The St. Paulinus **P.E.** kit consists of: a white t-shirt with the school logo, blue (or black) shorts, and a pair pumps/trainers. As an optional extra, a dark coloured pair of jogging trousers and a school P.E. hoodie or jumper can also be worn when we are outside / during the winter months. Please may we take this opportunity to kindly remind all families that the School PE kit is uniform and that pupils should <u>not</u> come to school in clothes that do not form the School PE kit.

> Children must come to school in their P.E. kit on their P.E. days and will stay in their P.E. kits throughout the day.

In addition, the <u>only</u> jewellery permitted in school is a pair of plain small stud earrings. If your child has pierced ears, then they need to remove their earrings on each morning of P.E.

Please note that staff are not able to remove earrings, so this will result in your child not taking part in our P.E. lessons and an alternative task will be provided for the child, this is due to health and safety reasons.

- > Long hair must be tied back.
- All P.E. kit <u>MUST</u> be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can easily be returned to the rightful owner.

**Please ensure your child wears their P.E. kit on their P.E. days.** If your child does not come to school in their P.E. kit, you may receive a text message to inform you that they need it for the following week. All P.E. kit and school uniform <u>must</u> be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can then be easily returned to the rightful owner.

<u>Homework</u> - This will be handed out on a **Friday** on Google Classroom and <u>MUST</u> be completed and returned to school by the following <u>Wednesday</u>. Spelling tests will be completed on Friday.

Spelling will be done on a Monday and handed in on a Monday for the following week test.

Children will have an independent reading book which will be brought home. It must be returned to school once read. Children can be reading their own independent book from home or school library/class reading area once they have finished the given book and completed a book review.

Children's independent reading books are changed as and when required in school. It is your child's responsibility to make sure a member of staff in class is aware that the book needs changing. Reading records are to be completed each time you listen to your child read at home. Equally, your child can complete the record by mentioning the pages read and whether they have enjoyed it or not.


