## Year 6 - Spring Term Curriculum Letter

Welcome back after the Christmas holidays! We hope that you have all had a lovely Christmas / New Year and are looking forward to the academic year ahead.

## Our History theme this half term is ... 'The Mayans'

We will learn who the ancient Maya people were and where and when they lived. We will use maps and atlases to locate Maya cities and identify countries in Mesoamerica. In addition to this we will learn about the religious beliefs and rituals of the ancient Maya people and find out more about some of the many gods they worshipped. We will also learn about the Maya number system and have the opportunity to read and write Maya numbers and solve number problems. We will learn about the Maya writing system too and practise writing words using logograms and syllabograms in the hieroglyphic style of the ancient Maya people. We will learn about the work of the explorers John Lloyd Stephens and Frederick Catherwood and have the opportunity to analyse historical pictures of the cities they discovered. We will also learn about the types of food eaten by the ancient Maya people and will find out about the significance of corn and chocolate, arguing which was most important in a class debate. In <u>R.E.</u> we will be studying the topics 'Exploring the Mass' and 'Jesus the Messiah'. There will be further opportunities to contribute to Act of Worship sessions and fully immerse themselves in the spirituality of the school. **At home**, encourage discussions with children relating to these topics focusing on key terminology and its meaning.

In <u>Mathematics</u> we will use our Number knowledge and understanding (place value, ordering & sorting, four operations, fractions, decimals & percentages) as a foundation to build on in applying these skills to problem-solving and reasoning situations. (Further information can be found on the topic plan). Also, we will look at converting units of measure, perimeter, area and volume, algebra and ratio in preparation for the end of year SAT assessments. **At home,** please encourage regular Maths games involving dice, mental calculation of numbers and money, practical use of Maths in shopping making it relevant to the real world wherever possible and finally to continue to practice and learn their **times tables** making use of the games on the 'TT Rockstar' website.

In <u>English</u> we will firstly be focusing on the award-winning Robert Swindells' novel 'Room 13'. It is a wonderful, spooky story about a school trip set in Whitby with good characterisation, a believable setting, humour and the ability to make the unreal seem real. The scary plot grips the reader from the opening paragraph. We will then move on to the best-selling novel, 'A Monster Calls' by Patrick Ness which is about love, loss and hope where a child's monster isn't what it seems. The author skilfully weaves an extraordinary and heart-breaking tale of mischief, healing and above all, the courage it takes to survive. These texts will allow the children to extend their narrative writing whilst also providing excellent opportunities for non-fiction genres such as newspaper reports, persuasive writing, instructions and poems. At home, please encourage regular reading of fiction & non-fiction. Continue to promote the love for books and try to allow your child the opportunity to discuss the texts they've read. Through discussion at home, encourage them to develop their vocal expression in their written language, their understanding of the meaning of words and the effects they have. Remember - 'They have to be able to say it before they can write it.'

In <u>Science</u> our learning will focus on 'Let it Shine' then 'We're Evolving' (Further information can be found on the curriculum plan). At home, encourage their curiosity in the world around them so that they ask questions and seek to find the answers to everyday events.

## Physical Education (P.E.) - is on Tuesdays and Fridays,

The St. Paulinus **P.E. kit consists of: a white t-shirt with the school logo, blue (or black) shorts, and a pair pumps/trainers.** As an optional extra, a dark coloured pair of jogging trousers and a school P.E. hoodie or jumper can also be worn when we are outside / during the winter months. Please may we take this opportunity to kindly remind all families that the School PE kit is uniform and that pupils should <u>not</u> come to school in clothes that do not form the School PE kit.

Children must come to school in their P.E. kit on their P.E. days and will stay in their P.E. kits throughout the day.

In addition, the **only** jewellery permitted in school is a pair of plain small stud earrings. If your child has pierced ears, then they need to remove their earrings on each morning of P.E.

Please note that staff are not able to remove earrings, so this will result in your child not taking part in our P.E. lessons and an alternative task will be provided for the child, this is due to health and safety reasons.

- Long hair <u>must</u> be tied back.
- > All P.E. kit <u>MUST</u> be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can easily be returned to the rightful owner.
- Please ensure your child wears their P.E. kit on their P.E. days. If your child does not come to school in their P.E. kit, you may receive a text message to inform you that they need it for the following week. All P.E. kit and school uniform <u>must</u> be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can then be easily returned to the rightful owner.

<u>Homework</u> will continue to be set on <u>Monday</u> through 'Google Classroom' and <u>MUST</u> be completed and submitted by the following <u>Friday.</u> This gives the children enough time to see their class teacher if they are struggling. The purpose of this work is to consolidate the learning from class and to prepare them for more intensive homework at high school. It is therefore extremely important that this work is completed. If a child does not complete their homework without a valid reason, they will be asked to stay in and complete it at break/lunchtime. No homework three times in a half-term, a letter will go home notifying parents.

Children will have an independent reading book which will be brought home on a daily basis and MUST be returned to school every day. Reading records will be given to the children for parents to fill out as and when their child reads during the week at home.




## Google Classroom

## Mayans & Monsters

## Mathematics – As mathematicians we will:

- Consolidate and extend our knowledge and understanding of 'Number' whilst applying these skills to problem-solving and reasoning situations.
- Continue our work on fractions, learning how to order and compare, convert, add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions
- Understand the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages
- Recognise angles at points where they meet and find missing angles in shapes.
- Co-ordinates describe positions on 4 quadrant grid.
   Draw, translate, & rotate shapes on the co-ordinate plane plus reflect them on the axes.
- Measure Problem-solving activities that include the calculation & conversion of units of measure using decimal notation to 3 decimal places.
- Read, write & convert between standard units of length, mass, volume & time. Convert between metric and imperial units of measurement.
- Calculate the area of parallelograms & triangles.
- Statistics Interpret & construct pie charts, line graphs and solve problems. Calculate the mean, median & mode.
- Algebra express missing numbers, sequences, equations.
- Ratio relative sizes of 2 quantities, sharing/grouping.

## French - As linguists we will:

- Study a French traditional tale le lièvre et la tortue.
- Write own traditional tale in French.
- Compare French and English School routines.

# PSHE - We will learn about how the media can influence people:

- Media Literacy.
