Polling station - school closed Thursday 6 May 2021


Electoral Services have the legal right to close our school in order for it to be used as a Polling station and so we have little choice but to close for this day.

The winners of EYs / KS1 and KS2 are 1W & 6C they will receive extra playtime for their attendance.






Attendance Matters

St. Paulinus Catholic Primary School is committed to the continuous raising of achievement of all our pupils. Regular attendance is critical if our pupils are to be successful and benefit from the opportunities presented to them. Attendance and punctuality are important to allow children to achieve their full potential during their time at school.

As a school we consider attendance to be extremely important and would like the continued support of our parents in ensuring their child attends school regularly and on time. We have a zero tolerance policy on parents taking their children out of school to go on holiday. Kirklees Council will issue penalty notices or it may lead to fast track prosecution at the magistrate's court, if you are convicted, you could be fined up to £1000 and you will get a criminal record, this is regardless of your child's attendance percentage.

Where ever possible please arrange for your child to have their appointments after school or in the school holiday.

Our gates open at 8:30 am, please ensure your child arrives before 8:45. Children arriving late on a regular basis will receive late marks and their punctuality will be monitored. If you are having difficulty getting your child to school on time, please contact Mrs Watt.
