Year 1 - Autumn Term Curriculum Letter

Welcome back after the summer holidays! We hope that you have all enjoyed your summer break and are looking forward to the academic year ahead.

This term we are looking forward to lots of new and exciting things.

In <u>**R.E.</u>** this term we will be focusing on 'God's Great Plan' and 'Mary Mother of God'. Throughout this topic, we will explore the creation story, think about God's wonderful creations and investigate the events leading to Christmas. We will also be thinking about what makes us special and what ways we can share God's love and message with those around us.</u>

In <u>Mathematics</u> - This term we will reinforce children's basic Mathematical skills by working on numbers within 20 and addition and subtraction up to 20. We will also be working on 2D and 3D shapes, naming them and discussing the properties of them. You can help your children by looking at numbers in the environment, practising simple addition and subtraction and discussing shapes all around us – finding examples and naming them.

In **English** - We will be reading and exploring the book. 'Kipper's Toy Box'. This links nicely to our History topic of Toys. We will be writing sentences, using adjectives and a wide range of punctuation. Throughout reading we will be asking questions such as; which is your favourite character? Why? Where is the story set? What do you think will happen next? One fun way to encourage writing at home, is to ask your child to write their own version of the story. When doing this, please support your child in using their phonics skills to sound out words carefully and to use full stops and capital letters. Another way to encourage this is to write a letter to their favourite character within the story.

In <u>Science</u> - We will be learning about 'Everyday materials'. You can help your child's understanding by discussing different objects around the home and what they are made from and why they might be made from that material. We will also be looking at Seasonal change throughout the year so it would be lovely to discuss the seasonal changes that we can see around us as we move in to Autumn.

Physical Education (P.E.) - will take place in both classes on **Wednesdays** and **Thursdays**.

The St. Paulinus P.E. kit consists of: a white t-shirt with the school logo, blue (or black) shorts, and a pair of pumps. As an optional extra, a dark coloured pair of jogging trousers and a school PE hoodie or jumper can also be worn when we are outside / during the winter months. Children must come to school in their PE kits on their PE days and will stay in their PE kits throughout the day.

In addition, the **only** jewellery permitted in school is a pair of plain small stud earrings. If your child has pierced ears, then they need to remove their earrings on each morning of P.E.



Please note that staff are not able to remove earrings, so this will result in your child not taking part in our P.E. lessons and an alternative task will be provided for the child, this is due to health and safety reasons.

Long hair must be tied back.

Please ensure your child wears their PE kit on their PE days. If your child does not come to school in their P.E. kit, you may receive a text message to inform you that they need it for the following week. All P.E. kit and School uniform must be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can then be easily returned to the rightful owner.

Homework and Reading– Homework and an additional piece of phonics work will be sent home every **Friday** evening. Homework is to be returned by the following **Wednesday** in order for children to be awarded Dojo points.

Children will have a reading book which will be brought home on a daily basis and MUST be returned to school every day. We will change your child's book once a week. Please remember to write in your child's reading record to acknowledge that you have listened to your child read. It is also very important to check your child's understanding when reading. Finally, please remember to access <u>Bug</u> <u>Club</u>.
