Year 6

In **RE**, as part of our 'Justice' topic, we have learnt about the work of Oscar Romero, a bishop from El Salvador, who dedicated his life to defending the

rights of the poor and demanded political change in a non-violent manner. Sadly he gave his life for what he believed in.



In **Music**, we have been listening to and appraising various 'Jazz' compositions of leading jazz musicians from Duke Ellington to Ian Gray focusing on 'pulse,

rhythm, tempo, pitch and timbre'. We then tried to replicate the tunes on musical instruments.



In **English**, we have been creating 'acrostic poems' to describe the scenes from our class book, 'Oranges in

No Man's Land' using powerful, emotive language to engage the reader and paint a picture of a war-torn city.
