

Year 3

This week, in **RPSHE**, Year 3 have created their very own Memory Jars. We have decorated our jars and filled them with lovely memories of special times spent with our families.

The children will be bringing their memory jars home so that they can add more memories whenever they like.





This week we have been developing our mark making techniques in **Art**.

Year 5

We had to work very carefully and have good control as the patterns were quite intricate. We then used these mark making techniques to imagine what the inside of a thistle head would look like.





This week in **Science**, Year 4 observed experiments to see how states can change. We were very interested in evaporation and condensation.







We have also thoroughly enjoyed our **P.E.** lessons this week. We have been focussing on aiming as an introduction

to archery and also enjoyed some passing and shooting practise during football.



Year 6

This week in **P.E.** we have been learning the skills and rules for 'Dodgeball'. We

focused on our throwing (including 'fake throws to trick an opponent) and catching techniques. Then we applied them to a match situation.



In **Art**, we continued to develop our observational, pencil drawings this time enlarging a section of our work. We then chose a type of different art medium such as ink.

In **RPSHE**, we continued to work on our 'Digital Wellbeing'. This week, we looked at being a 'Digital Citizen'. This meant we discussed ways in which we can be safe, healthy and respectful in our online behaviour towards others within digital communities.
