please help us to trust in you, to share your love and be a blessing to each other and to all those in need.



This week in **Science** we have been investigating how shadows are formed as part of our light and dark unit. We recapped on night and day and used torches and globes to demonstrate what happens as the earth rotates. We then used opaque objects to block the light rays from the light source and created our own shadows.

#### Year 5


We had a very different **History** lesson this week where we took part in an online lesson from BBC Teach! The BBC produced a lesson about the

We also compared our modern classroom to a Victorian classroom. We were very interested and found out lots of new information. Some of us have also been watching 'Dodger' at home!

In **RE** this week we have been looking at sainthood and what it means to be a saint. We discussed all of

the different values and virtues that a saint has, as well as how they live by the Beatitudes.

This week in our 'Ancient Greece'
History lesson, we have been learning about 'Gods and Goddesses'.
We studied what they were known for (i.e. Poseidon, God of the Seas) plus signs and symbols associated with them.



In Art, continuing with our drawing focus, we took an enlarged section of our observational drawings and used a different art medium to represent it, 'collage'.



In RPSHE, we continued to promote a culture of positive mental health in our classrooms with a variety of activities to celebrate all our achievements and our ambitions for the future.
