Year 3

'Year 3 have started our first lesson in Orienteering in P.E. They enjoyed this and enhanced their ability to communicate to make sure that their letter and word formation was easily identifiable by others.'



Year 5

In **Art** this half term Year 4 are focusing on 3D art. This week we began our unit project of making our own 3D shoes. We created a mould of our own shoe using tissue paper and masking tape! The next step will be for us to design our shoe and add our design to our mould!
