

Attendance Every Day is important!

St. Paulinus Catholic Primary Academy is committed to the continuous raising of achievement of all our pupils. Regular attendance is critical if our pupils are to be successful and benefit from the opportunities presented to them. Attendance and punctuality are important to allow children to achieve their full potential during their time at school.

As a school we consider attendance to be extremely important and would like the continued support of our parents in ensuring their child attends school regularly and on time. We have a zero tolerance policy on parents taking their children out of school to go on holiday. Kirklees Council will issue penalty notices or it may lead to fast track prosecution at the magistrate's court, if you are convicted, you could be fined up to £1000 and you will get a criminal record, this is regardless of your child's attendance percentage.

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Asda's 'The Kids Eat' initiative provides children meals for just £1

Supermarket giant Asda has announced its latest scheme in an effort to help feed children this summer.

Children across England and Wales will be able to eat for just £1 at any time of day in Asda Cafés, seven days a week, with no minimum adult spend required. According to Asda, the effort is to tackle holiday hunger at a time when the cost-of-living continues to rise. At the stores, various locations, children aged 16 and under can access a hot or cold meal for just £1.

The Kids Eat for £1 initiative is available all day, every day from 25 July until 4 September in England and Wales, dependent on the store and opening hours. There will be a hot meal or cold meal, or both, on offer. Baby food is also available as part of the initiative, those will be able to enjoy a free pouch of Ella's Kitchen baby food (70g pouch) in their local Asda Café.



Year 3 visit - Sheffield Botanical Gardens

Health & Fitness Week

Monday - Healthy Eating

Year 4 enjoyed trying a wide range of fruits! We tried our best to eat a bit of everything and were pleasantly surprised with how much some of us loved kiwi and pomegranate!



Year 5 looked at the 'Eat Well' plate and created their own versions of this, discussing the importance of a balanced diet and the benefits that it has. They also made yoghurt bowls with different fruits and granola.



Year 6 studied healthy eating examining the different food groups, their nutritional value and how our eating patterns affect the planet. The children then made their own overnight oats and fruit recipe.



Tuesday - Commonwealth Games

Year 6 had a mini-gym session in the Dance Studio where the children followed a circuit of activities designed to boost their fitness, stamina and hand/eye co-ordination. The activities were boxing, exercise bikes, hula hoops, step-ups, dumbbells, agility ladders, skipping and stacking cups.



Wednesday / Thursday - Sports Day

EYU enjoyed their first school's sports day, taking part in sprint, egg and spoon, quoited balance, up and under and hop there, jump back.



First Aid

Year 5 explored the British Red Cross and the wonderful work that this charity does, including helping the elderly, providing care to refugees and helping people during the pandemic. We also looked at some First Aid skills, with a focus on how to help someone with a broken bone. We then created 'How to help' posters to display our knowledge.



Friday - Mindful & Mental Health Year 3 discussed the meaning of Mindfulness and how important it is to maintain a healthy mind - to go with a healthy body. They mentioned 'reflection', 'relaxing', thinking about what is right and wrong'. They agreed that time to reflect needs to be a quiet time with no issues around and no pressure. To that effect, the children used their initiative to use colours that suited their mood to complete wonderful designs.'
