## Autumn Term Curriculum Letter

This term we are looking forward to lots of new and exciting things.

In **R.E.** this term we will be focusing on 'God's Great Plan' and 'Mary Mother of God'. Throughout this topic, we will explore the creation story, think about God's wonderful creations and investigate the events leading to Christmas. We will also be thinking about what makes us special and what ways we can share God's love and message with those around us.

In **Mathematics** - This term we will reinforce children's basic Mathematical skills by working on numbers within 20 and addition and subtraction up to 20. We will also be working on 2D and 3D shapes, naming them and discussing the properties of them. You can help your children by looking at numbers in the environment, practising simple addition and subtraction and discussing shapes all around us – finding examples and naming them.

In **English** - We will be reading and exploring a brand new book called Little Red. This is a different version of the traditional tale Little Red Riding Hood and provides lots of thinking and discussion opportunities. We will begin the year writing a list of all the things Little Red takes in her basket and focus on using capital letters correctly, forming letters and writing on the lines. We will then move on to writing a character description and using some fantastic adjectives to describe the wolf and Little Red. It would be really helpful if you could practise writing at home as much as possible, things such as name writing, and shopping lists would really benefit your child.

In **Science** - We will be learning about 'Everyday materials'. You can help your child's understanding by discussing different objects around the home and what they are made from and why they might be made from that material. We will also be looking at Seasonal change throughout the year so it would be lovely to discuss the changes that we can see around us as we move in to Autumn.

**Physical Education (P.E.)** - under the new guidelines, **children must come to school in their P.E. kits** ready for lessons.

- The St. Paulinus P.E. kit consists of:
  - a plain white t-shirt with or without the school logo (no brands or patterns),
  - plain black or dark grey shorts / jogging bottoms or leggings (no brands or patterns),
  - grey school hoodie with the school logo,
  - Trainers or a pair of pumps.

# Year 1: Around the World

## Autumn Term Curriculum Overview

### Art - As artists we will :

- Use a range of painting techniques such as impasto and experiment with different paints.
- Study a famous artist and use our own artists rag.
- Mix paints to change their consistency and compare different brush strokes.
- Embellish textiles with Brusho.
- Explore different knotting techniques with textiles.
- Create a weaving with our embellished textiles.

### R.E. - As theologians we will :

- Be able to recognise the story of : Creation, Noah and the Ark, The Annunciation, The Visitation and The Birth of Jesus.
- Begin to retell the religious Bible stories through art work, drama and writing.
- Recognise that the rainbow is a religious symbol.
- Recognise some signs and symbols of Advent and Christmas and use some religious words.
- Recognise some ways in which we can look after God's World.
- Recognise some ways in which we and Christians prepare for Christmas.
- Be able to talk about feelings of God's World and experiences of being loved.
- Be able to talk about Christmas and how it makes us feel.

### Science - As scientists we will :

- Identify different everyday materials.
- Identify and classify different objects into what they are made from.
- Describe the characteristics and properties of materials.
- Identify, name, draw and label parts of the human body and name the senses.

### Geography - As geographers we will :

- Describe the main weathers (sun, rain, snow, hail and fog) in the UK.
- Identify and describe the four seasons, including the hottest and coldest season in the UK.
- Collect and present simple data about the weather.
- Understand the dangers of weather (floods and tornados).

### History - As Historians we will:

- Recognise how toys have changed.
- Compare toys from the past and today's toys.
- Experience playing with and learning about toys from the past.

### English - As writers and communicators we will :

- Include full stops, capital letters and finger spaces within our writing.
- Use phonics to help with spellings.
- Independently write a list, character description and retell a story.
- Use adjectives to describe.
- Begin to use cursive writing.
- Use drama to explore stories in greater depth.

### Computing - We will :

- Learn to log on independently.
- Know the importance of keeping usernames and passwords safe.
- Know how to be safe online.
- Learn how to save and find our own work.
- Explore different types of communication.
- Group and sort information into a pictogram.
- Explore the different tools on Purple Mash.

### Music - As musicians we will :

- Study Hip Hop music and find and clap to the pulse.
- Name what musical instruments we can hear.

### Mathematics - As mathematicians we will :

#### AUTUMN 1:

- Count, read, write, identify, represent, double and half, and use comparative language of numbers within 10.
- Addition and subtraction within 10. Combination and partitioning. Represent and use number bonds; read, write, interpret, represent and solve.
- Shapes and patterns— Recognise common 2-D and 3-D shapes; describe position, direction and movement.

#### AUTUMN 2:

- Numbers within 20—Count, read, write, identify, represent, double and half, and use comparative language.
- Addition and subtraction within 20 - Represent and use number bonds; read, write, interpret and solve one-step problems.

### Design Technology - As designers we will :

- Be able to evaluate our peers work stating what we like and dislike.
- Use a variety of equipment.
- Use a range of materials.
- Design and make a mechanism that works.

### RPSHE - we will :

- Be able to talk about our feelings and how are actions can change with our feelings.
- Find out what is the same and what is different about us.
- Learn how to stay healthy.
- Be aware of people that can help us.
- Try out best to be kind and caring to others

### P.E. - As gymnasts we will :

- Roll, catch and throw balls to each other.
- Roll and retrieve a hoop.
- Balance on large and small body parts.
- Perform balances on low apparatus.
