Year 5 are learning about different countries in **French**.

One of our **P.E.** units for this half term is hockey. We began by practising our dribbling skills and then worked on our ability to accurately pass a ball with the hockey stick.





As part of our daily worship, we have been enjoying the new opportunity to fully plan and deliver our own worships to the class.

RPSHE: 'How the media can influence people'.

This week, we have continued to focus on our digital wellbeing and how the media, including online experiences, can affect people's wellbeing – their thoughts, feelings, and actions. We also examined how mixed messages in the media exist (including about health, the news, and different groups of people) and that these can influence opinions and decisions both positively and negatively. Finally, we designed and produced an information poster reminding people on where to get reliable information from the internet (and other media outlets) and how to avoid 'fake news'.





Music: 'How Does Music Teach Us About Our Community?'

We have looked at how music is linked to how humans build community, friendship, kinship and peace, and to how we learn about and understand each other. We have also learnt about the role of music and how music is also very significant to collective and individual identity. We discussed the types of music we listen to and how it can help people get to know you, an insight into your feelings and your personal identity. Finally, we listened to different styles and artists, and examined how listening to other people's music, can teach us a lot about respect and values.

Regular attendance is critical if our pupils are to be successful and benefit from the opportunities presented to them. Attendance and punctuality are important to allow children to achieve their full potential during their time at school.

As a school we consider attendance to be extremely important and would like the continued support of our parents in ensuring their child attends school regularly and on time. We have a zero tolerance policy on parents taking their children out of school to go on holiday. Kirklees Council will issue penalty notices or it may lead to fast track prosecution at the magistrate's court, if you are convicted, you could be fined up to £1000 and you will get a criminal record, this is regardless of your child's attendance percentage. Where ever possible please arrange for your child to have their appointments after school or in the school holiday, if you are unable to make an appointment during this time can you please arrange the appointment after 14:30 rather than morning.
