The children in every year group are used to sitting end of year assessments and we have been working hard on helping our children understand that you do not need to be afraid of a test or an assessment - the only difference between Year 2 and Year 6 SATs to the ones the children sit in Years 1, 3, 4 and 5 is that these tests are marked in school and the results are only shared with parents and not with the DfE. Of course we want to do well but ultimately all I ask is that every child tries their best - and you can't ask for much more than that! A score on a test paper doesn't define you and doesn't tell people what a wonderful person you are. So just go into every test thinking I will be proud of myself and others will be proud of me if I try my best!

Don't forget it is non-uniform day on Friday 26 May - we are all coming dressed in white to celebrate Pentecost Day. We have chosen white because it is the liturgical colour that is used on this day and it represents 'Joy'. Your child will learn all about Pentecost over the day and I am sure they are looking forward to all the fun activities they will take part in.

Year 4 Multiplication

The week commencing 6 June, Year 4 will complete their multiplication check within school. This is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Each child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete. Please encourage your child to keep practising their times-tables at home and use TT rockstars to practise answering at speed.

All of Year 4 are working incredibly hard on this and we now just need that final push!


The winners of KS1 and KS2 were Reception and Year 6 who will receive extra playtime next week for their attendance last week.

As a school we consider attendance to be extremely important and would like the continued support of our parents in ensuring their child attends school regularly and on time. We have a zero tolerance policy on parents taking their children out of school to go on holiday. Kirklees Council will issue penalty notices or it may lead to fast track prosecution at the magistrate's court, if you are convicted, you could be fined up to £1000 and you will get a criminal record, this is regardless of your child's attendance percentage. Where ever possible please arrange for your child to have their appointments after school or in the school holiday, if you are unable to make an appointment during this time can you please arrange the appointment after 14:30 rather than morning.


