

### **Autumn Term Curriculum Letter**

In <u>R.E.</u> – we are covering the topics 'Chosen People' and 'Mysteries'. The children will listen to stories about God choosing Abraham, Moses and Daniel. They will also learn about The Trinity, Mary and Joseph and Jesus as God's gift to us.

In <u>Mathematics</u> — children will continue to follow the Maths Mastery Programme of Study. Year 1 children will reinforce children's basic Mathematical skills by working on numbers within 20 and addition and subtraction up to 20. They will also be working on 2D and 3D shapes, naming them and discussing the properties of them. You can help your children by looking at numbers in the environment, practising simple addition and subtraction and discussing shapes all around us — finding examples and naming them. Year 2 children will be looking at reading and writing numbers up to 100, partitioning numbers into tens and ones, addition and subtraction of 2-digit numbers and word problems linked to these methods. We will then use units of measure and apply our knowledge to read scales and order and compare length.

In <u>English</u> – we will be focusing on year group expectations for spelling and grammar and using the text 'Hanzel and Gretel" in Autumn 1. We are keeping our next book secret so the children can develop their prediction skills when reading the text. These books will provide a stimulus to produce a character description, narratives, letters and a non-chronological report. Please help by ensuring your child practises words from the Year 1 & 2 spelling list and read with them regularly at home.

In <u>Science</u> – Year 1 children will be learning about Everyday materials. You can help your child's understanding by discussing different objects around the home and what they are made from and why they might be made from that material. We will also be looking at Seasonal change throughout the year so it would be lovely to discuss the changes that we can see around us as we move into Autumn. Year 2 children will be building on their previous learning and learning about the uses of different materials and their properties, and how materials can change.

### Physical Education (P.E.) - Tuesdays and Wednesdays

Under the new guidelines, **children must come to school wearing their P.E. kits on these days, ready for lessons**. Please may we take this opportunity to kindly remind all families that the school P.E. kit is uniform and that pupils should <u>not</u> come to school in clothes that do not form the school P.E. kit.

- The St. Paulinus P.E. kit consists of:
  - o a plain white t-shirt with or without the school logo (no brands or patterns),
  - o plain black or dark grey shorts / jogging bottoms or leggings (no brands or patterns),
  - o grey school hoodie with the school logo,
  - Trainers or a pair of pumps.
- In addition, the <u>only</u> jewellery permitted in school is a pair of plain small stud earrings. If your child has pierced ears, these need to be removed on each morning of P.E. for health and safety reasons.

Please note that staff are not able to remove earrings, so this will result in your child not taking part in our P.E. lesson and an alternative task will be provided for the child, this is due to health and safety reasons.

- Long hair must be tied back.
- All P.E. kit (including school uniform) must be labelled clearly with your child's name. If it becomes lost, it can then be easily returned to the rightful owner.
- Please ensure your child wears their P.E. kit on their P.E. days.

<u>Homework</u> – Homework will be sent home every **Friday** evening. Homework is to be returned on or before the following <u>Wednesday</u>. It will build on what the children have been learning about in class.

Homework will consist of Maths and English. They will bring home a weekly spelling list of 10 words. They will be only tested on 5 of these. The words will link to the sounds they have looked at in their Phonic lessons that week or common exception words.

<u>Reading</u> - The children will have individual 1:1 reading time at least once a week. They <u>must</u> bring their reading books to school on their reading day, which will be clearly labelled on their reading bag. This means that we can read that book with the children. We will have an additional book in school which they will read if they are heard additionally to their set day. Please ensure that your child reads their reading book with an adult at home and that the adult questions the understanding of the text read. So, we know your child has read, please comment in their reading record.

# English – As writers and communicators we will

- Write a letter.
- Write narratives from personal experience.

## Maths - As mathematicians we will

- Read and write numbers to 100.
- Know the place value of 2-digit numbers.
- Know our number bonds to 10 and 20.
- Compare and order numbers to 100. Use < and >
  - Add and subtract 1 and 2-digit numbers.
- Count in steps of 2, 5 and 10s.
- Recognise odd and even numbers.
- Understand that the 2 times table is same as doubling.
  - Draw and measure lengths in cm's.
- Compare and order lengths in m's and cm's.
- Construct pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables and ask and answer questions.
  - Problem solving will be included in ALL areas of Maths.

## History - As historians we will

- Learn about a historical significant event The Great Fire of London.
- Learn about the life of a significant individual Samuel Pepys who has contributed to our history
- Discover how things such as London, houses and fire safety have changed over the years.

# **Geography** – As geographers we will be

- Know the names of and locate the 7 continents of the world. Know the names of and locate the 5 oceans of the world.
- How the continents are made up e.g. Europe is made up of several countries just as the UK is.
- Know where the Equator, North Pole and South Pole are on a
