For their attendance last week, the winners <u>3J</u> will receive a treasure chest of goodies to share in class.



#### St. Paulinus Day

Fr. Jonathan came to celebrate St. Paulinus day with us on Tuesday. We had a whole school mass in the hall. Jonathan the stained glass windows of St. Paulinus they have made. The children were very reverent and joined in the prayers extremely well. The parishioners who attended mass complimented the children on their fantastic singing.







#### Year 3



Last Friday, Father Jonathan came to visit Year 3 to answer some questions the children had about his role within the Christian community. It was a very entertaining morning and the children learnt a lot about the role of a Parish Priest. #### World Mental Health Day

On Tuesday, our school celebrated 'World Mental Health Day' with a KS1 and KS2 assembly delivered by Julia from Kirklees 'Keep in Mind'.

The focus was on 'Worries', how to identify them, what exercises the children can do to deal with them (e.g. breathing techniques, worry jars, worry monsters) and if they become too much, where they can seek help and support both at home and in school.

Each class then did follow up activities in their weekly RPSHE lessons to promote a positive mental health and wellbeing.
