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
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### The Feast of Christ the King, Year A

#### SHARING GOD'S GOSPEL



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Jesus said to his disciples, "When the Son of Man comes in majesty, all people will be gathered before him. #### Photographs / Videoing of Events



Generally photographs of children for school or family use are a source of pleasure and pride. However, we live in an age which has seen rapid changes in the technology of image reproduction.
