Outcome of our OfSTED Inspection

The overall outcome was: Requires Improvement. This means that the school is providing a satisfactory or adequate education but there are things we will be working on to move the school to providing a great education. We were very close to achieving this, and hope to achieve it during the next inspection. Personal development, Safeguarding and Behaviour and Attitudes all came out as strong and achieved a grading of "Good". There are no further actions to take in these areas so school's focus will be on the Quality of the Education: the curriculum and on what all learners know and remember so that they can talk confidently about this to future inspection teams. The full OfSTED report is on the website or you can request a copy from the office.

Areas of strength:

- Provision for safeguarding
- Our RPSHE curriculum
- Pupils could talk with maturity and great knowledge about keeping themselves and others safe, how to help one another and about protected characteristics and other faiths – one child said "the most important thing is love"
- Our opportunities for pupil leadership
- Our phonics and reading provision for the children
- A clear love and passion for reading was seen across the school
- Behaviour was excellent
- Attitudes towards learning were excellent
- Strong SEND provision has been implemented which will have a good impact in the future
- Leaders within the school are making the right decisions and focusing on the right areas of need and development. These are already being tackled and addressed.
- Impact has already been seen where leaders have put their focus and inspectors were sure that would happen in the new areas for development
- Good teaching and learning was seen across the school in most classes and in most lessons

Areas for development: This is what school will be working on until the next inspection.

- Ensure that all curriculum subjects have all the knowledge fully defined this will enable teachers to close any gaps left over from the pandemic and from the change over of curriculum so that all pupils, including those who are working below age related expectations can build upon their knowledge and know and remember more in every subject.
- On occasions, some pupils were not given the right task to address the historical learning gaps and match the things they need to learn to close these gaps. School will be supporting, where necessary, teachers in developing meeting the needs of all learners and in designing tasks to enable them to succeed and closing those gaps in knowledge from previous years e.g. over the pandemic.
- Early Years needs to develop their curriculum further so that the children are more ready for Year 1 and beyond.

Bobby Theatre on Gang and Knife Crime

On Monday, the Penguin Acting and Theatre Production Company came into school to work with our Year 5 and 6 pupils. They provide topical based performances and exploratory workshops to explore themes such as bullying and friendships. The theme of Monday's drama was 'Bobby,' a drama that follows the journey of a 12-year-old boy

and his struggles in being unknowingly drawn into the growing issue of county lines, including gangs and knife crime. This piece is in response to the increasing levels of youth and gang violence in Kirklees.

The children watched the events unfold and then had the opportunity to ask each character questions. At the end, all the actors talked to the children about themselves, their theatre company, and the thought-provoking issues they touched on.



HSBC Workshops





On Wednesday, HSBC bank visited Years 5 and 6 to deliver two workshops on banking. Firstly, Year 5 learnt about 'Shopping Sense'. This session looked at how our spending decisions can impact other people. That people have different feelings about saving and spending money. How our spending decisions can be based on my priorities and ethics and how our spending decisions can help support others.

Then, Year 6 had their 'Banking 101' session. They learnt about 'smart gaming'- how to stay on top of their spending online and how to avoid identity theft. The children looked at why some children might overspend in online games and how to make the right decisions, they looked at how too much screen time can affect both their mental and physical health and a variety of exercises they can do to look after themselves. Finally, the children looked at keeping their identity safe online and the security measures they need to have in place.
