
Therefore this week <u>Class 5T</u> are the winners and will receive a treasure chest of goodies to share with their class.

WOW Badge Design Competition Winner

Over the last few years, St. Paulinus has been working with the 'Living Streets' charity whose mission is to achieve a better walking environment and inspire people to walk more, where walking is the natural choice for everyday local journeys. We embraced the 'WOW – Walk to School' challenge which is a pupil-led initiative where children self-report how they get to school every day using the interactive WOW Travel Tracker. If they travel sustainably (walk/wheel, cycle, or scoot) once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge.

The badges are designed by pupils and this year, the theme for the next academic year's badges was alternative views of getting to school. A number of our pupils entered the competition and out of thousands of entries from

schools across the whole of the country, Gabriella K (in Year 6) was chosen as one of the twelve winners and her design will be created into a badge children can earn next year -a superb achievement!

Poppy Playtime - Warning to Parents

It is important that you are aware that whilst the name and characters suggest a playful game. It is a survival horror game with graphics that may not be suitable for your child. A horror game character from 'Poppy Playtime' named Huggy Wuggy has been raising concerns amongst parents, police and safeguarding professionals.

Parents should be warned that their children may be viewing graphic fan-made videos that are popping up on platforms such as YouTube and TikTok.

Some created videos feature songs alongside animation, designed to be upsetting and 'creepy'. Others feature jump-scare animations. The videos appear across several popular platforms, in particular on TikTok and YouTube.
